Check #36431 dated April 15, 2021 for \$403.00 was received from Mountain-Valley Emergency Medical Services Agency for AMR reimbursement for January, 2021. Check #60560 dated March 9, 2021 for \$25.51 was received from FTC v A1 Janitorial Sup Corp Refund Acct for refund on overcharged supplies.

There were 39 fire calls with the breakdown as follows: 19 EMS; 1 grass fire; 1 illegal burn; 4 injury traffic collisions; 2 mutual aids; 1 non-injury traffic collisions; 2 other fire; 3 public assists; 1 rescue; 3 station standbys; 1 vehicle fire and 1 wires down. Swartz/Muller moved to pay the bills. Motion carried.

Bids are currently being collected to have the station reroofed/recoated and the gutter repaired/replaced. Swartz and Scott will bring a recommendation to a future meeting.

Lexipol is finalizing the contract with Stanislaus County.

The Volunteers plan to hold the September Tri-Tip BBQ as usual.
